

Enduring Powers of Attorney (EPAs) they still valid? Yes, but ...

What is an EPA?

This is a document where someone (the donor) appoints one or more people as their attorney(s). The attorneys can look after the donor's financial affairs should the donor want them to, or if the donor has lost, or is losing, mental faculties.

Attorney (LPAs) - Property and Financial Affairs and Health and Welfare - on October 2007. Existing EPAs remain valid, EPAs, unless the donor has lost capacity. but new ones cannot be prepared.
